Are you and your learner meeting every week?

A consistent commitment and practice is the path to achieving literacy goals,

Meeting consistently for two hours of tutoring each week is our minimum program requirement and a proven way for adult learners to make progress and reach their literacy goals.

Infrequent or inconsistent tutoring sessions don't allow learning to take root and literacy skills to flourish with the necessary practice and repetition that leads to mastery.

While the occasional cancellation for medical or planned away times is understandable and well within the scope of our program, please let us know if you or your learner are frequently unable to meet for two hours each week.

We want to help all our learners reach their goals in this program. Sometimes a reminder helps, and it's always worth a try.

Try a PLAYAWAY An ALL-IN-ONE Audiobook

Would you or your learner like to try an audiobook without the need for the internet or an app? The Sonoma County Library now offers portable lightweight media players pre-loaded with an audiobook. They are called "Playaways." These all-in-one devices allow you to listen to audiobooks without the need for any additional equipment or connections other than your own earbuds or headphones and a triple-A battery. You can check them out for three weeks with your library card.

FREE Internet on the spot

The Sonoma County Library is lending WiFi hotspots to patrons, enabling Sonoma County Library cardholders to have free access to the internet on a first-come, first-served basis.

"SonomaFi," the WiFi hotspot lending program is a pilot. The initial lending period will be 14 days per device, and they will be available at all library branches, but cannot be placed on hold.

Each SonomaFi device will allow the borrower to connect multiple devices, including smartphones, computers and tablets, so an entire household can use one SonomaFi hotspot at once.

For more information on SonomaFi, stop in at any of the library's 14 branches. The SonomaFi program is paid for from Measure Y sales tax funds, the community's investment in free public libraries.
