- Learner joined the American Association of University Women (AAUW). She attends events with me. She looks up words and is always willing to speak. What a fabulous student and woman!
- Learner wants to leave a record for her grandchildren of how she came to the U.S. and became a citizen. We work on a paragraph or two each session. She gets positive feedback from the grandkids and is motivated to keep at it.
- Learner's writing skills are improving with practice. She really enjoyed the writing exercise and choosing different topics...then she wrote more sentences at home.
- Learner is a delight to teach. She loves learning and always does more than I ask.
