Model for Adult Learners: Ask a Librarian

Our library wants to help all patrons feel comfortable asking for help from a library staff member, and one of our program goals is to have adult learners become library users.

Sometimes our adult learners are not comfortable with *who or how* to ask for help in a library. One of the things tutors can do to help adult learners become confident and independent library users, is: take them with you when you go up to ask for help at the library.

In the beginning, you can model how you ask a librarian for help with the adult learner right at your side – listening and observing the process. Next time, try having them take more of an active role in this process.

Adult Learners Tell Us ...

- Got my license!!! Reading books. Reading captions on TV. Using computer and iPad.
- Reading is getting better.



Adult Literacy Tutors Tell Us ...

- Learner's vocabulary building is steadily improving. She is gaining confidence...reading Young Adult novels.
- Learner's spelling is improving: Student only missed 2 out of 20 words that were previously difficult for her to spell. Began reading out of a library book.
- Learner attended a conference with her son's teacher and understood all the information in English.
- Both Learners read to their children all the time. One has a poster of sight words up on her wall that she is teaching her son, and her daughter reads to her regularly.
- (I) just completed the Harassment-Free Workplace Training for library volunteers and found it to be very worthwhile and well-done. It was comprehensive yet easy to understand. Thank you for including volunteers in this training.
- We read together and identify new vocabulary. We keep a running list of vocabulary words.
- Learner read two biographies of Cesar Chavez and wrote a biographical sketch of his life. Shows good reading comprehension.
- We made a crustless vegetable quiche and a salad with an emphasis on nutrition to complement one of her goals: to cook and plan nutritious meals.
- Learner was issued her library card.
- We're working on the first 100 questions for Naturalization test! Such a joy to teach!
- We are really enjoying our time together each week! Learner really enjoyed reading about Wangari.
